K. Santhanam (1913-1980)

Freedom fighter, politician, and journalist, Kasturiranga Santhanam was born in 1895 in Madras. He went on to complete his law degree from Law College, Madras and practiced at the High Court of Madras from 1920 onwards.


An active member of the national movement, K. Santhanam joined the Indian National Congress at a young age. He participated in the non-cooperation movement in 1920 and was imprisoned several times for his role in the satyagraha movements. He played an active role in Gandhiji's Constructive Programme of Khadi and Village Industries, and between 1922 and 1930, he organized movements to encourage the production of khadi across Tamil Nadu.


K. Santanam also had a distinguished career as a journalist and became the first editor of The Indian Express. He later served as the joint editor of the Hindustan Times and the editor of Swarajya, a weekly established under the patronage of C. Rajagopalachari. K. Santanam also authored several books in English and Tamil, and some of his works include Gospel of Gandhi, Union-State Relations in India, Satyagraha and the State, An Anthology of Indian Literatures, and The Cry of Distress: A first-hand description of an Objective study of the Indian Famine of 1943.

A member of the Indian Legislative Assembly from 1937 to 1942, K. Santhanam served as the Joint Secretary of the Sapru Committee in 1944, which sought to resolve minority issues in Indian political discourse. He was elected to the Constituent Assembly from Madras in 1946 on a Congress Party ticket and frequently contributed on matters relating to adult franchise, local governance, and citizenship. K. Santhanam was appointed Minister of State for Railways and Transport in 1948 and became the Lieutenant Governor of Vindhya Pradesh state (present-day Madhya Pradesh) in 1952. He was also a member of the Rajya Sabha and served as the Chairman of the Second Finance Commission (1956), the Malayan Railway Economics Commission (1961), the Study Team on Panchayat Raj Finance (1962), and the Committee on the Methods of Elections to Panchayati Raj Bodies (1964).

In 1962, K. Santhanam was appointed as the chairman of the Committee on Prevention of Corruption. Based on its recommendations, the Government of India established the Central Vigilance Commission in 1964. K. Santhanam passed away on 28th February 1980.

About the Collection: The papers of K. Santhanam have been donated by his grandson, Ravi Santhanam. The papers include correspondence, speeches, lectures, parliamentary debates, and various articles authored by K. Santhanam. The materials cover important themes such as the Constitution of India, Indian federalism, economic policies, electoral politics, parliamentary democracy, the Emergency, planning, socialism, Indian languages, and reflections on the trajectory of the Indian Republic. Additionally, K. Santhanam's writings encompass his experiences as a freedom fighter, along with memoirs of prominent leaders such as Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, C. Rajagopalachari, and Sardar Patel. The collection also contains newspaper clippings, magazines, and several books written by K. Santhanam. These papers hold significant research value for the study of postcolonial Indian politics, economics, history, policy, and governance.

Personal correspondence of K. Santhanam with his friends and family. Includes a copy and an English translation of K. Santhanam's last letter to his wife, Sundaravalli before her death in Gandhi Ashram, Tiruchengode, while he was imprisoned in Vellore Jail (1931). Also includes several letters, postcards, and inland letter cards exchanged between Santhanam and his children, K.S. Ramanujam (also known as 'Thambi'), Babu, K.S. Rajagopalan (also known as 'Rajam'), Kamala, S. Kasthuri, and his granddaughter, Padma. The file also contains a letter from K. Santhanam to [Dr. George] and Dr. Dhawan, a letter from Mahendra A. Patel, and a letter from [S. Varadarajan] to his senior paternal uncle, A.S. Rajagopala Iyengar. K. Santhanam's letter to his friends on the Gandhi Centenary Year (22-12-1969) and letters from S. Radhakrishnan and S. Gopal expressing their condolences (1972) are also present.

2. 1946

Editorials written by K. Santhanam during his tenure as joint editor of the *Hindustan Times* from January to December 1946, addressing key contemporary developments, including the Indian independence movement and the transfer of power, Muhammad Ali Jinnah, Muslim League, communal violence, Indian National Army, Legislative Assembly affairs, international events and other major issues of the time.

ii) The Freedom Struggle and Early Independent India, 1940-1978

9. 1940-1977

Papers relating to the independence movement and the early years of independent India. Includes clippings on nationalist leaders such as Jawaharlal Nehru, Sardar Patel, Jayaprakash Narayan, Zakir Hussain, and Ganesh Vasudev Mavalankar. Contains K. Santhanam's personal accounts covering his experiences in journalism and the freedom struggle, including 'The Past and the Present', written in Trichy Central Jail (1940–41) with reflections on Mahatma Gandhi and the national movement; 'Some Experiences of the Freedom Struggle' (The Hindu, 21 January 1969), describing his imprisonment with Nehru in 1923; 'My Recollections of Gandhi Ashram' (1974); and an article in The Sunday Searchlight on his political contributions (1975). The papers also include writings on the Constituent Assembly, the early development of the Indian Constitution, the value of small newspapers, unity in diversity, election history, social and political change in early independent India, and the achievements of the Indian state. Santhanam's writing on India's general and state, election expenses and political propaganda, a proposed moral code for elections, single party and coalition governments, poll alliances, political defections, federal officers and electoral politics, and the Swatantra Party, Janata Party and the Jan Sangh. Also includes his journal article 'Political Parties and Indian Democracy' (1972) and writings such as, 'Minimum Programme for a Democratic Front' and 'Programme For a National Government'.

Santhanam's election campaign, his many visits and speeches at various public meetings. Nominations and the final list of candidates from various constituencies are also available.

15. <u>1960-1975</u>

The file contains press clippings. It includes cuttings from *Hindu*, *Mail*, *Eastern Economist*, and *Swarajya Weekly* relating to linguistic politics and education in India. Includes articles 'The Task Before Education Commission' (*Hindustan Times*, 28-7-1964), 'Transition to Hindi: Beware of Danger Signals' (*Deccan Chronicle*, 10-2-1965), and writings on the reorganization of states, medium of instruction in schools and colleges, debates over language and the Education Commission, the three-language formula, higher education, education inflation, and K. Santhanam's policy recommendations to improve the education system in India.

Also holds K. Santhanam's press statements and letters to newspaper editors on the need to revoke the emergency (June-July 1975) and his pamphlet Emergency, Discipline and Democracy (September 1975). Additionally, it features articles on amending the constitution and threats to democracy during the Emergency, S.K. Patil's letter to members of Parliament (July 3, 1975), an open letter to Indira Gandhi by an advocate, and a court judgement (September 1, 1975). Further contents include K. Santhanam's interview published in *Himmat* (16-7-1976), his article, 'How to protect democracy?' (1977) and K.S. Ramanujam's, 'Rise and Fall of Mrs. Indira Gandhi & Mr. Karunanidhi' (1978). There is also correspondence between K. Santhanam and V.M. Tarkunde, J.B.
